## The Bronx's Most Dangerous Roads

53 pedestrians were killed on Bronx streets in the three years from 2005 through 2007. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that East Gunhill Rd, Broadway, and Grand Concourse suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.


