

# Burlington County's Most Dangerous Roads

27 pedestrians were killed on Burlington County streets in the three years from 2005 through 2007. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that US 130 suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.

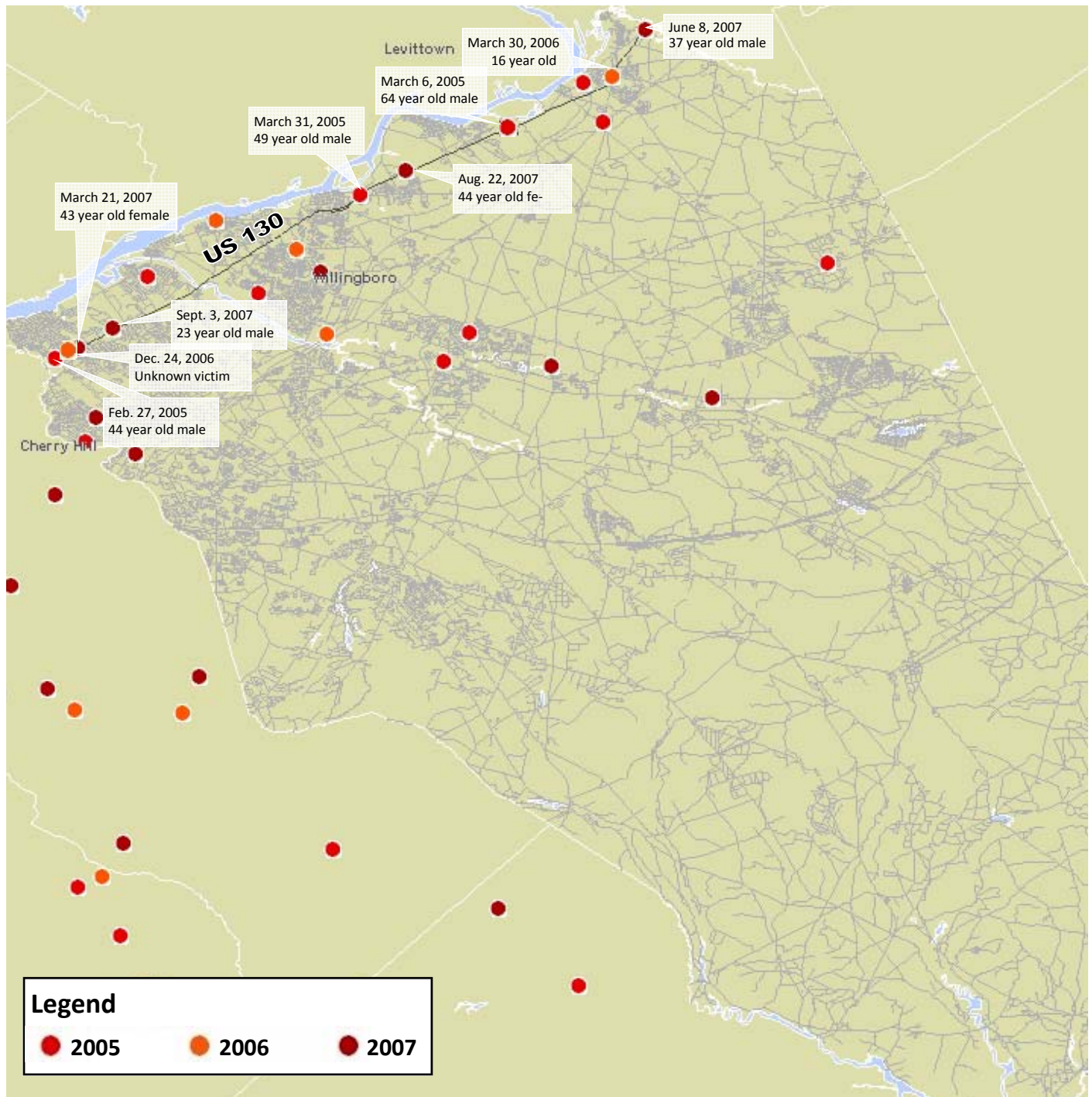
