

Connecticut's Most Dangerous Road

101 pedestrians were killed on Connecticut's streets in the three years from 2005 through 2007. The state's most dangerous road was Boston Post Road (US-1) running through Fairfield and New Haven Counties. Seven pedestrians were killed in traffic collisions along that 70-mile stretch of road from 2005 through 2007.

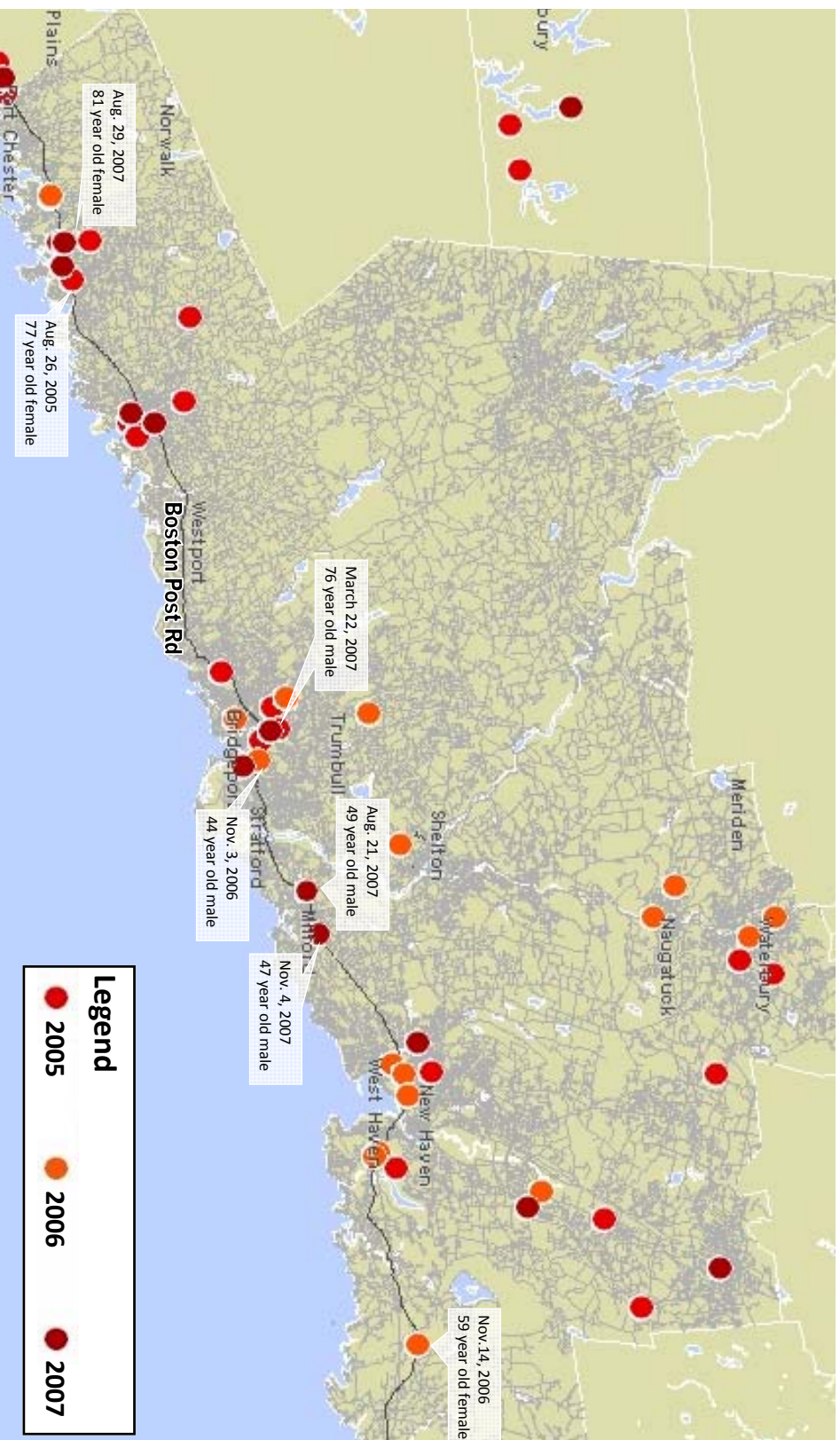
