Mercer County's Most Dangerous Roads

17 pedestrians were killed on Mercer County streets in the three years from 2005 through 2007. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that Routes 129 and 33 suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.


