## Connecticut Most Dangerous Roads

105 pedestrians were killed on Connecticut streets in the three years from 2007 through 2009. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that US-1 and US-5 suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.


