

# Essex County's Most Dangerous Roads

50 pedestrians were killed on Essex County streets in the three years from 2007 through 2009. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that McCarter Highway (Route 21), Bloomfield Ave, and Broad Street suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.

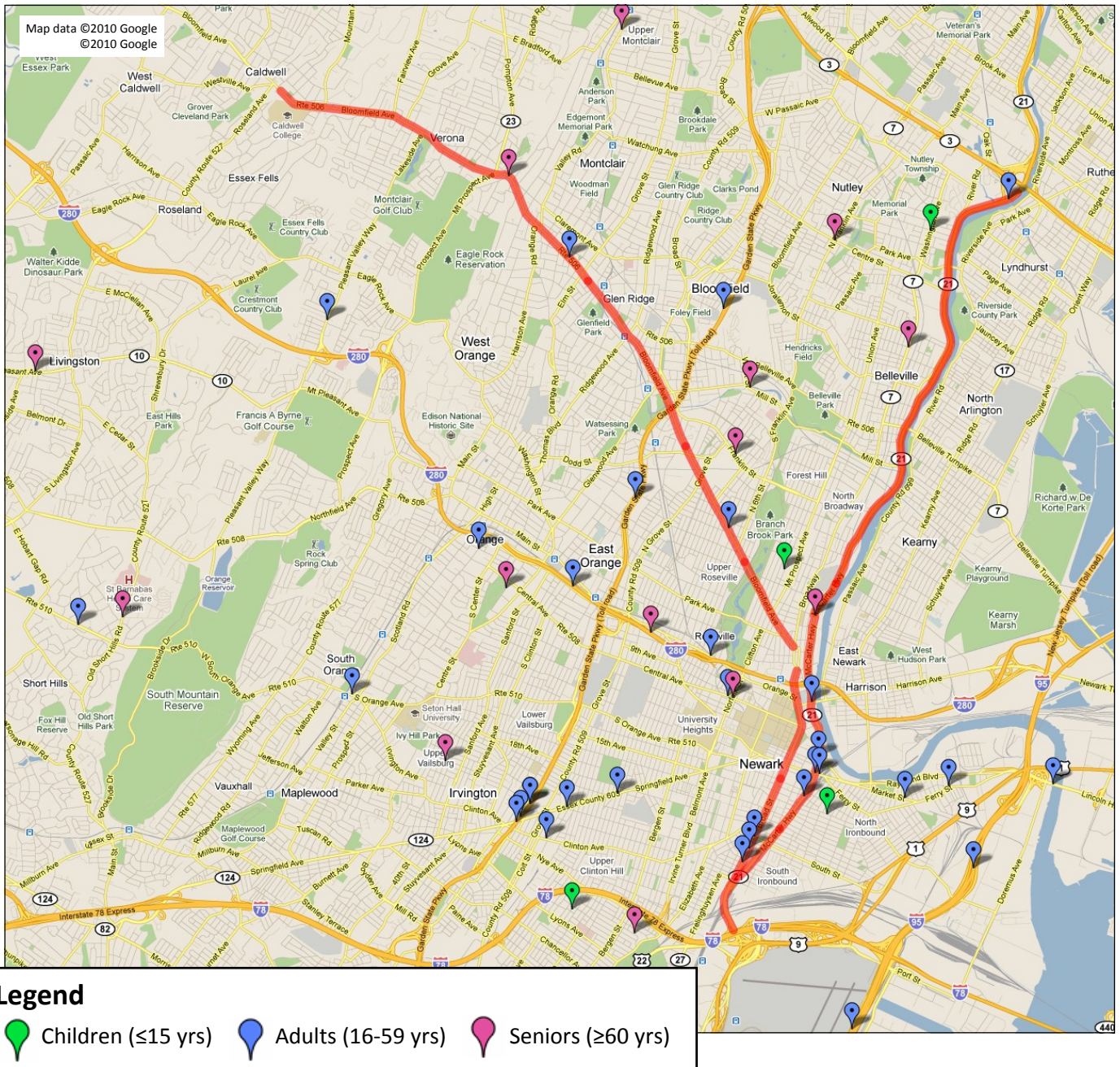
