

Nassau County's Most Dangerous Roads

87 pedestrians were killed on Nassau County streets in the three years from 2007 through 2009. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that Route 24 (Hempstead Tpke, Fulton Ave, Conklin Ave), Sunrise Highway, and Merrick Road suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.

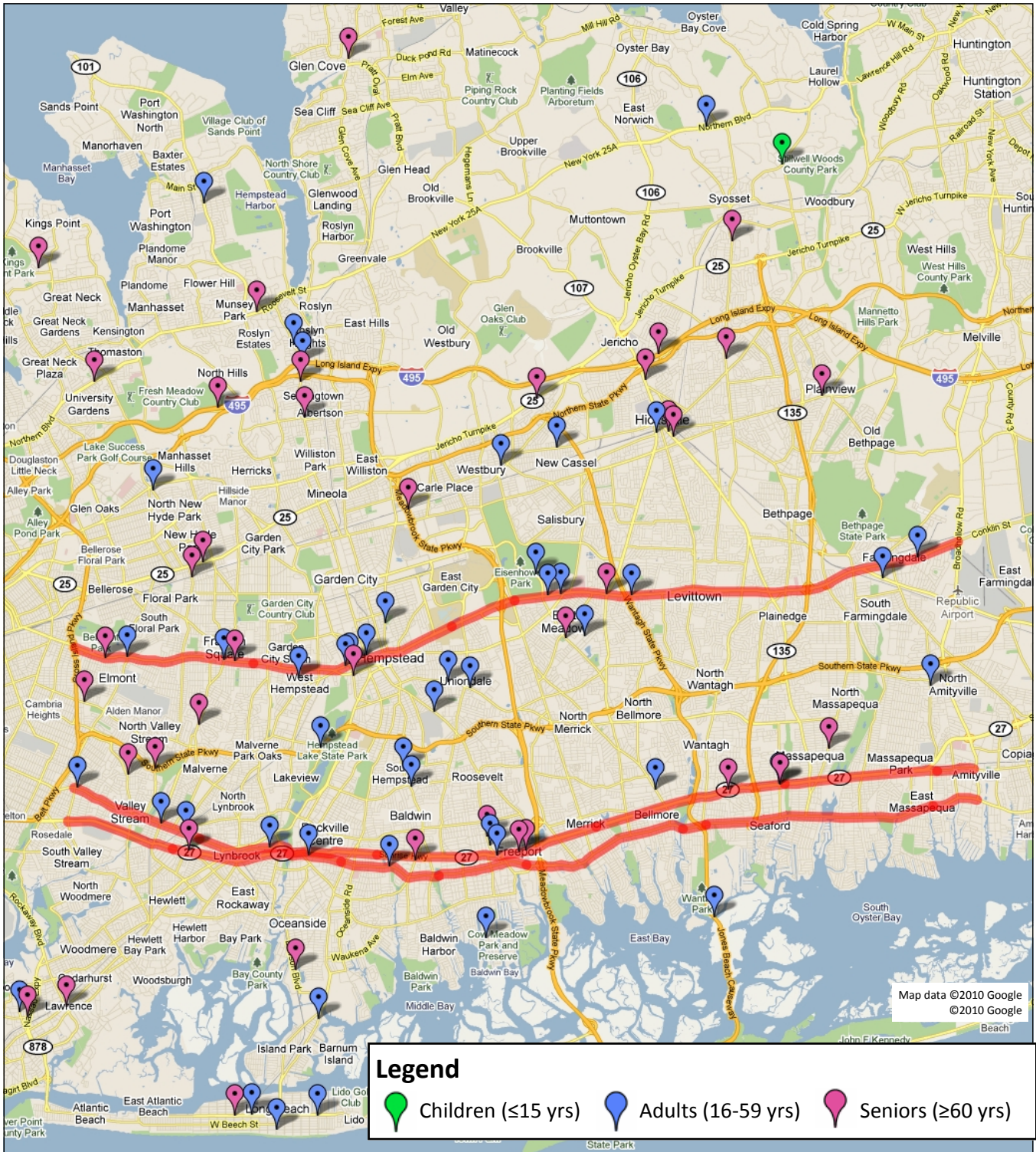
