

Queens' Most Dangerous Roads

109 pedestrians were killed on Queens streets in the three years from 2007 through 2009. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that Cross Bay Blvd, Jamaica Ave, Queens Blvd, Northern Blvd, and Union Tpke suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.

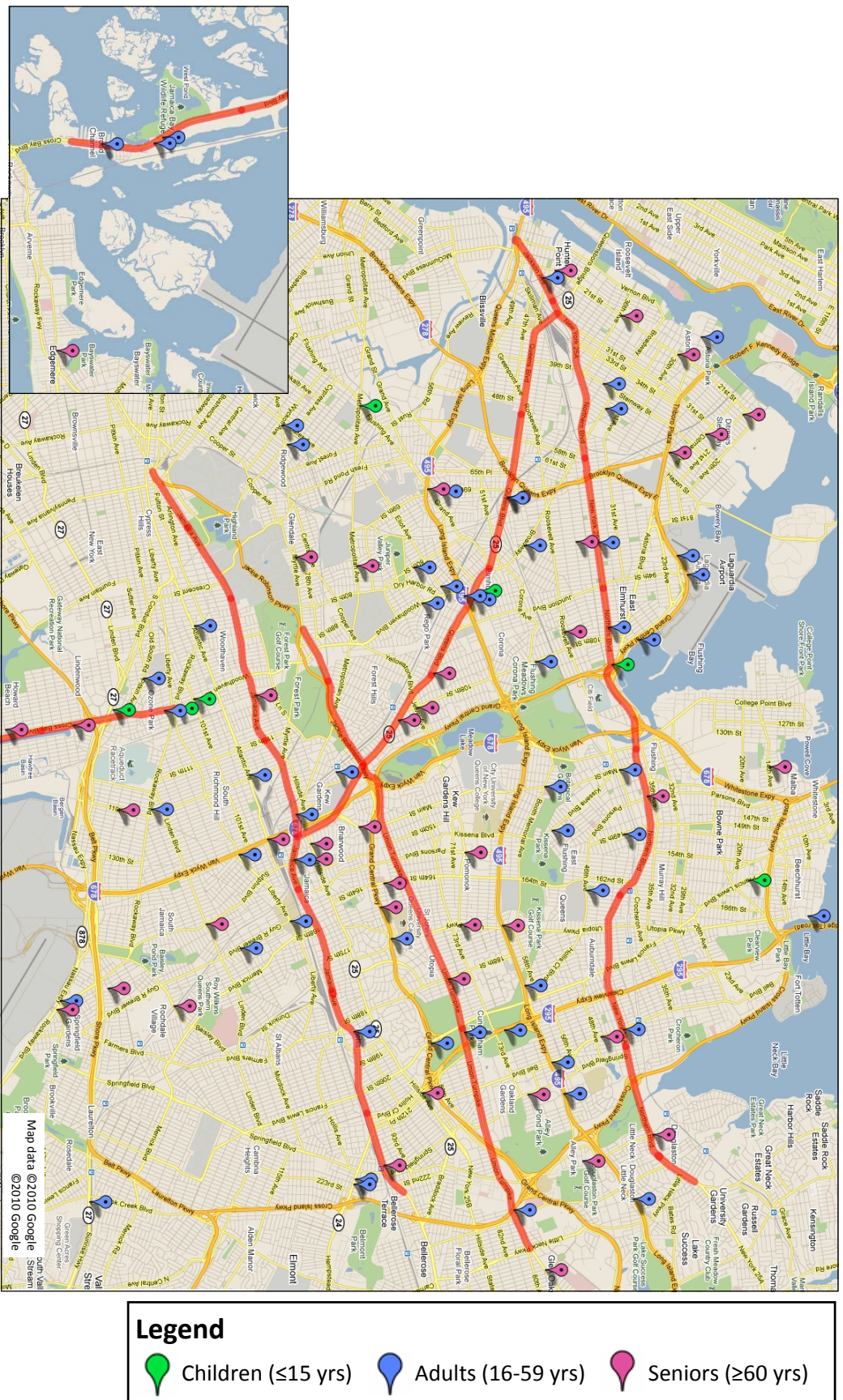
