

Suffolk County's Most Dangerous Roads

94 pedestrians were killed on Suffolk County streets in the three years from 2007 through 2009. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that Route 27 (Sunrise Hwy, CR-39, Montauk Hwy) and Route 25 (Middle Country Rd, Jericho Tpke, Main Rd) suffered the highest number of pedestrian

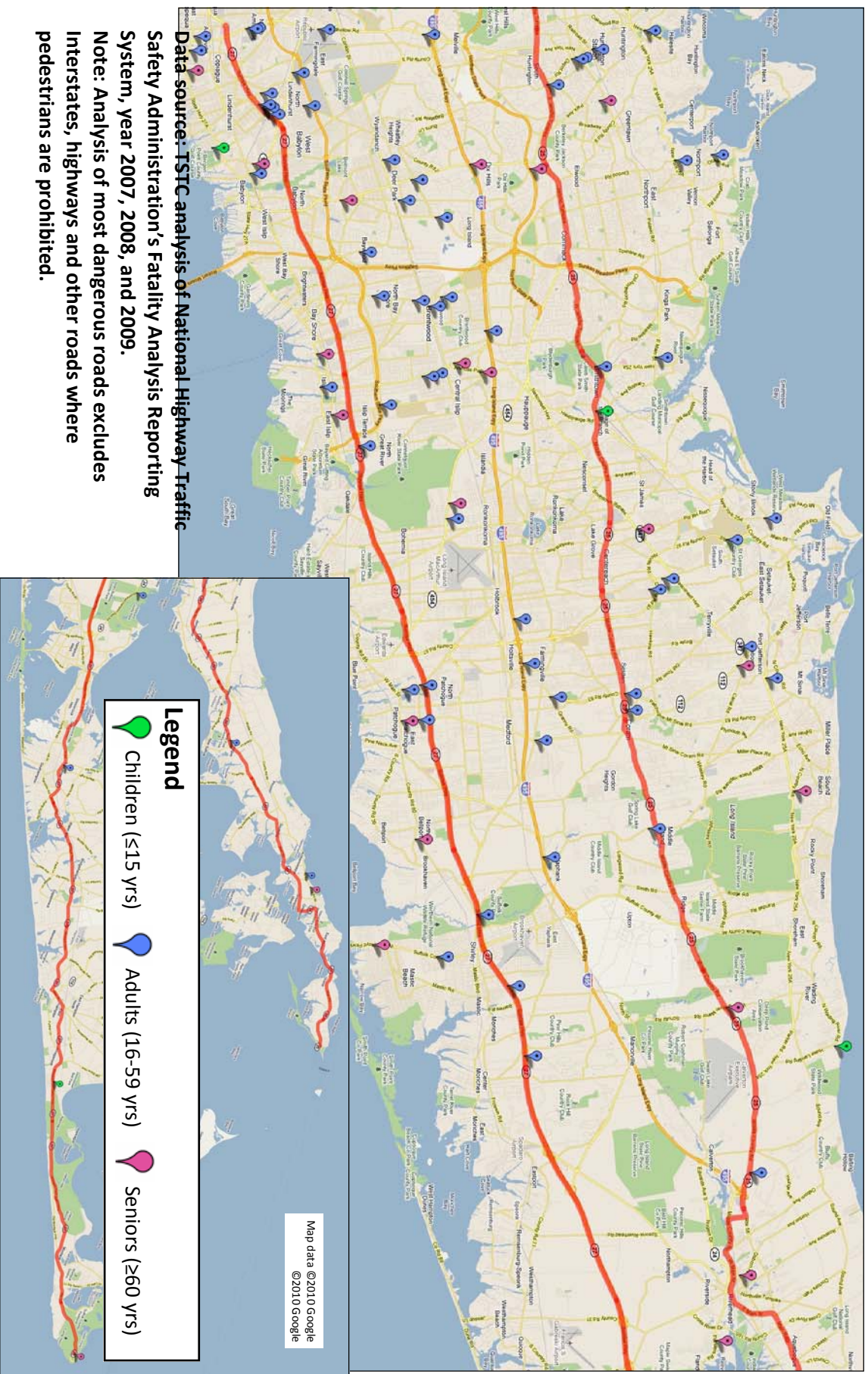
