Connecticut's Most Dangerous Roads

121 pedestrians were killed on Connecticut streets in the three years from 2008 through 2010. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-1 (Boston Post Road) and US-5 suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period. 3 pedestrians were killed in Westport along US-1, and 3 pedestrians were killed in East Hartford along US-5.


