Hudson County's Most Dangerous Roads

32 pedestrians were killed on Hudson County streets in the three years from 2008 through 2010. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Kennedy Blvd (Route 501), Tonnele Ave (US 1 & 9), and Avenue C suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period. Pedestrian deaths on these roads were in Bayonne, Jersey City and North Bergen.


