

Monmouth County's Most Dangerous Roads

26 pedestrians were killed on Monmouth County roads in the three years from 2009 through 2011. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Route 9, Route 36 and Route 35 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

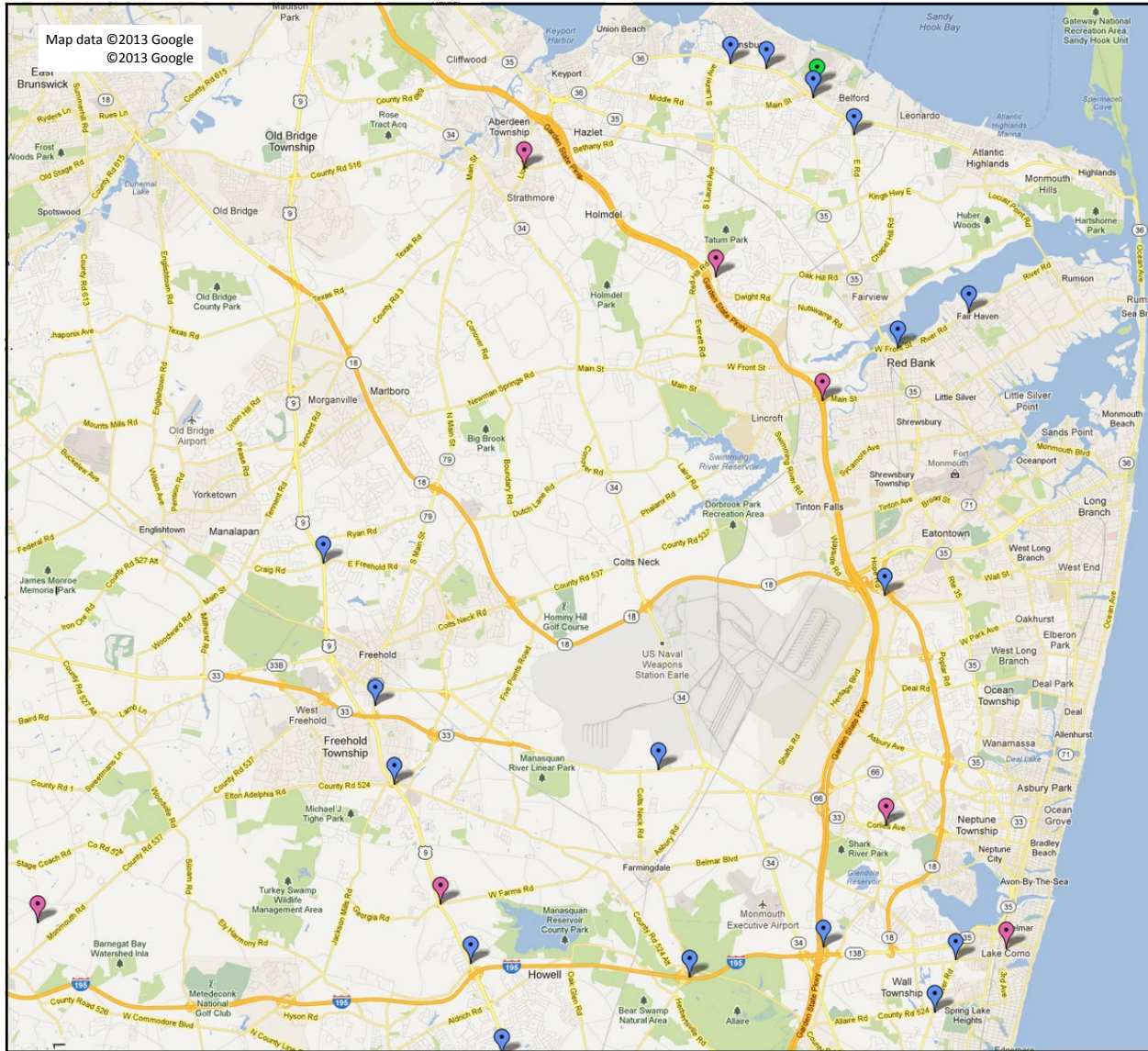
