Connecticut Most Dangerous Roads

100 pedestrians were killed on Connecticut roads in the three years from 2009 through 2011. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-1, Route 66 and US-44 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


