MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Burlington County

21 pedestrians were killed on Burlington County roads in the three years from 2010 through 2012. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-130 (Burlington Pike) had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

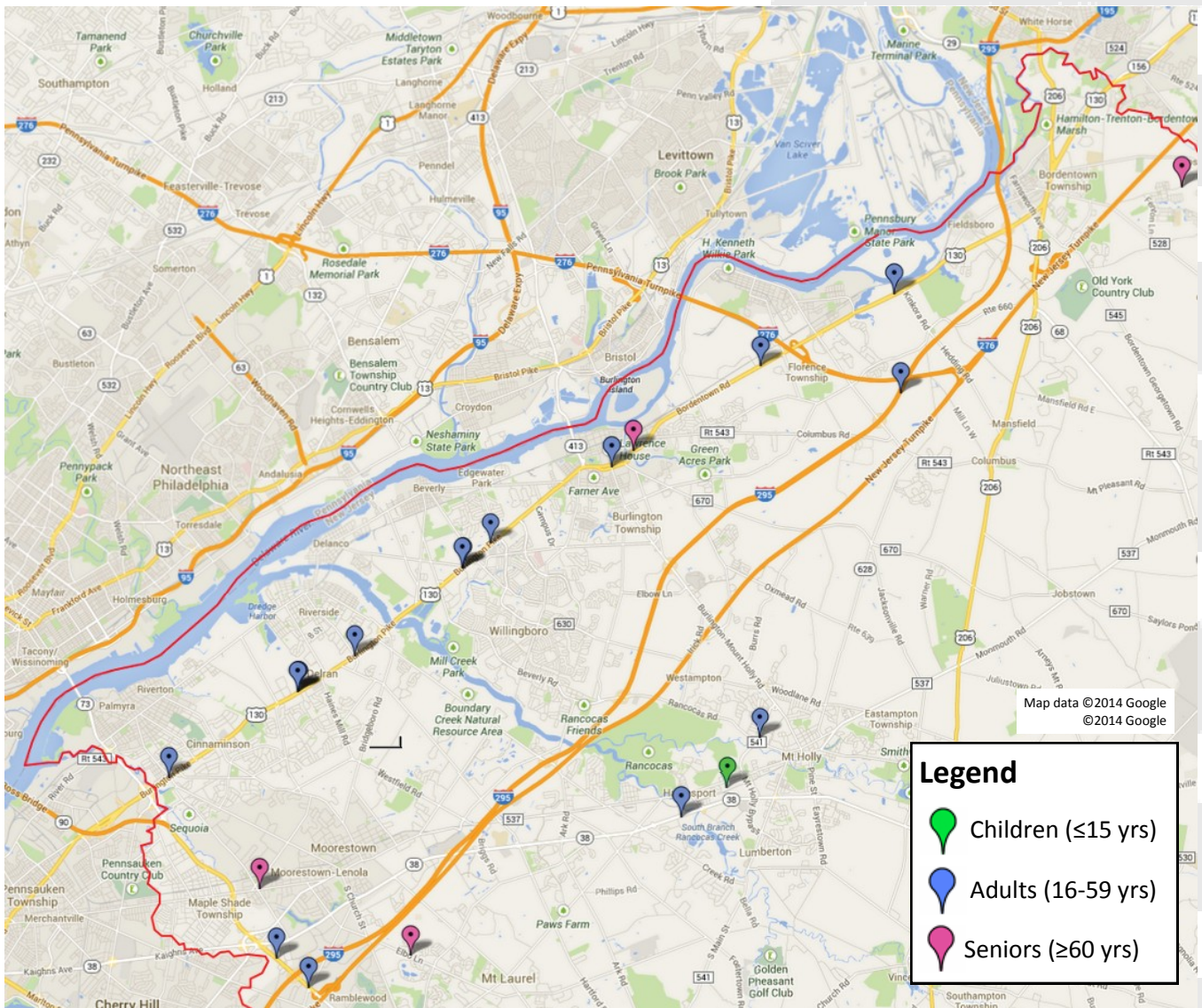
