

THE REGION'S

MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Cape May County

Five pedestrians were killed on Cape May County roads in the three years from 2010 through 2012. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Route 603 and Route 47 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


