

MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Middlesex County

42 pedestrians were killed on Middlesex County roads in the three years from 2010 through 2012. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-1 and US-9 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

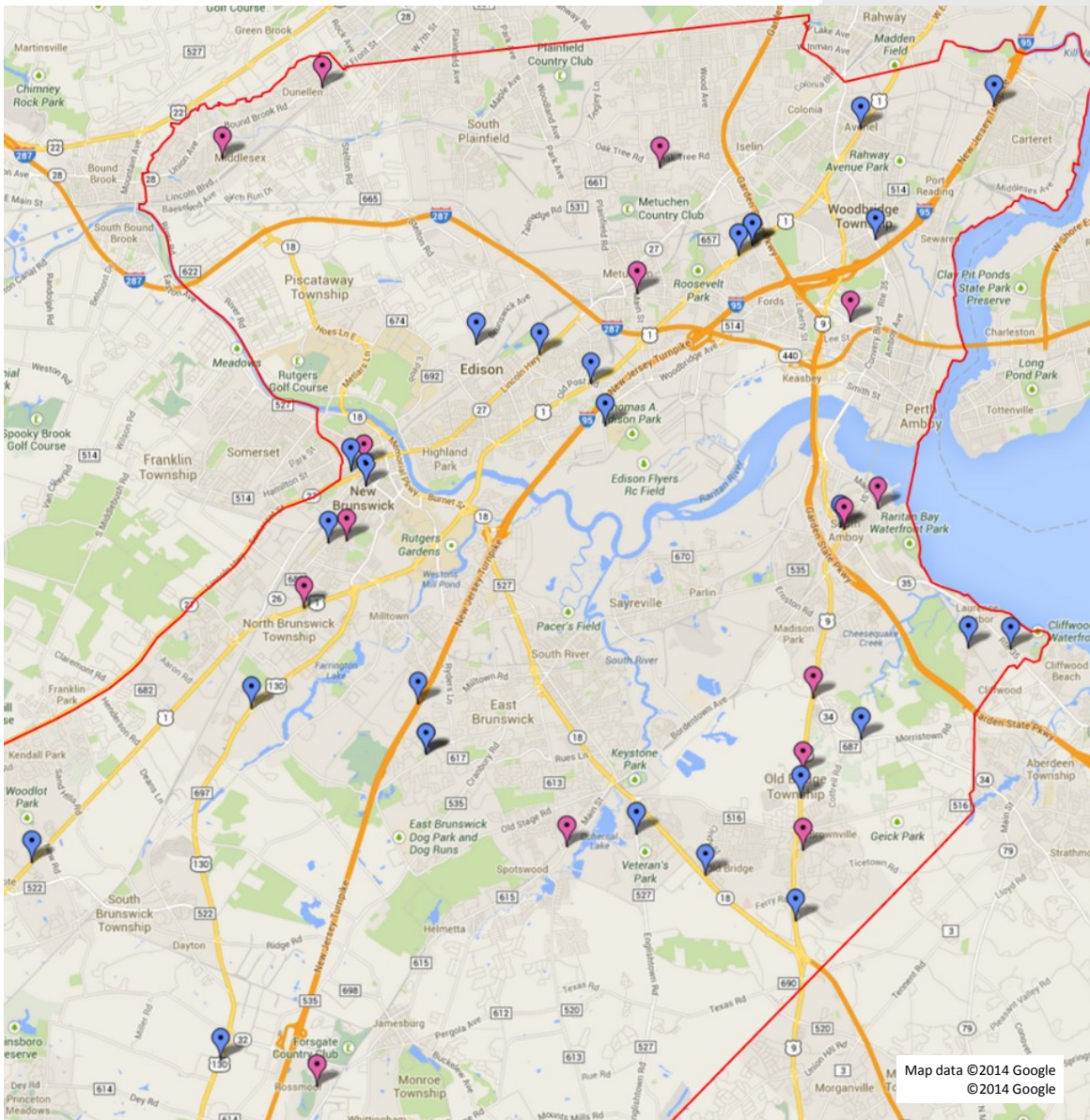
