Orange County

12 pedestrians were killed on Orange County roads in the three years from 2010 through 2012. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Middletown, Monroe and Newburgh each had two pedestrian fatalities over the period studied.

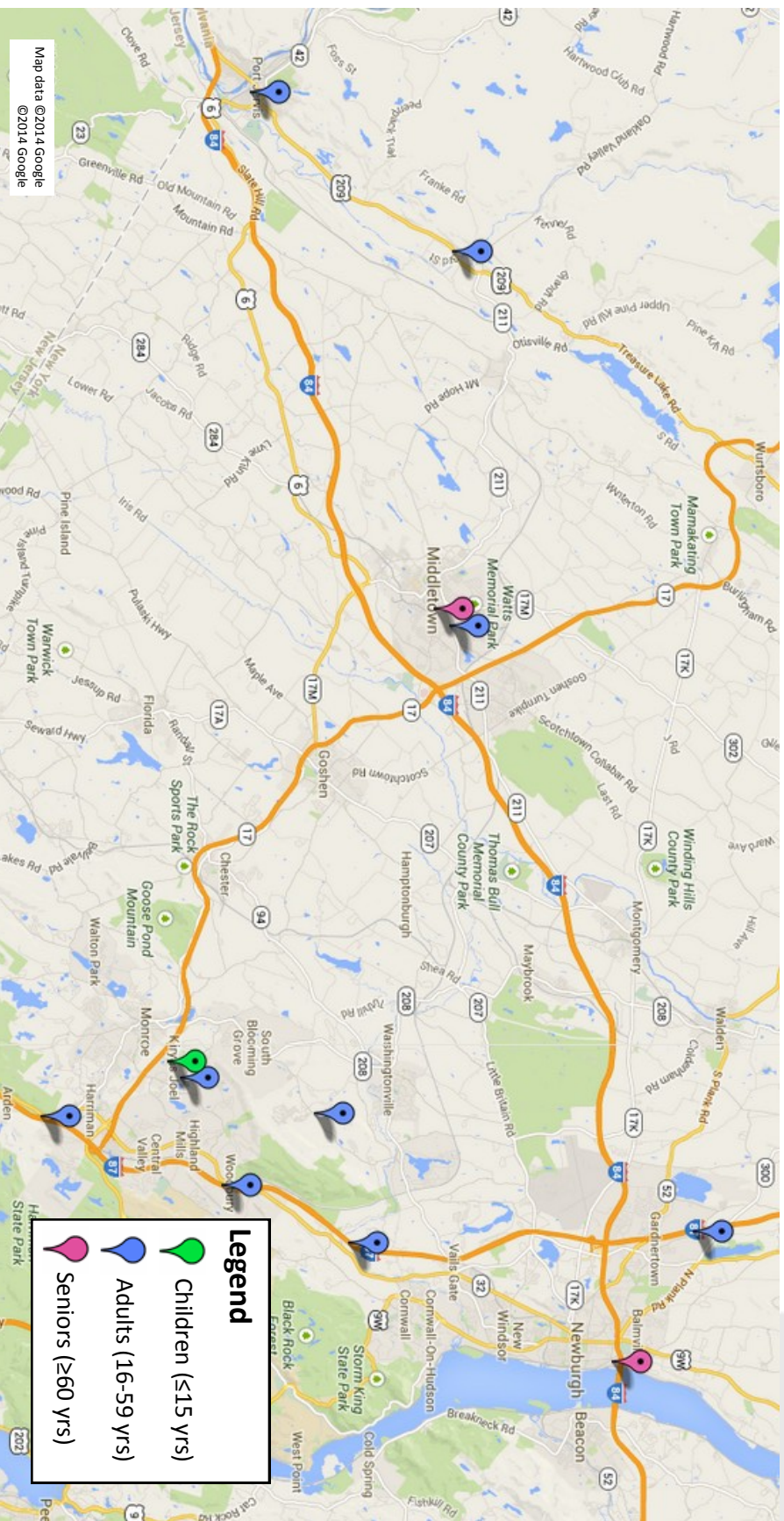
