MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Passaic County

29 pedestrians were killed on Passaic County roads in the three years from 2010 through 2012. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-46 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

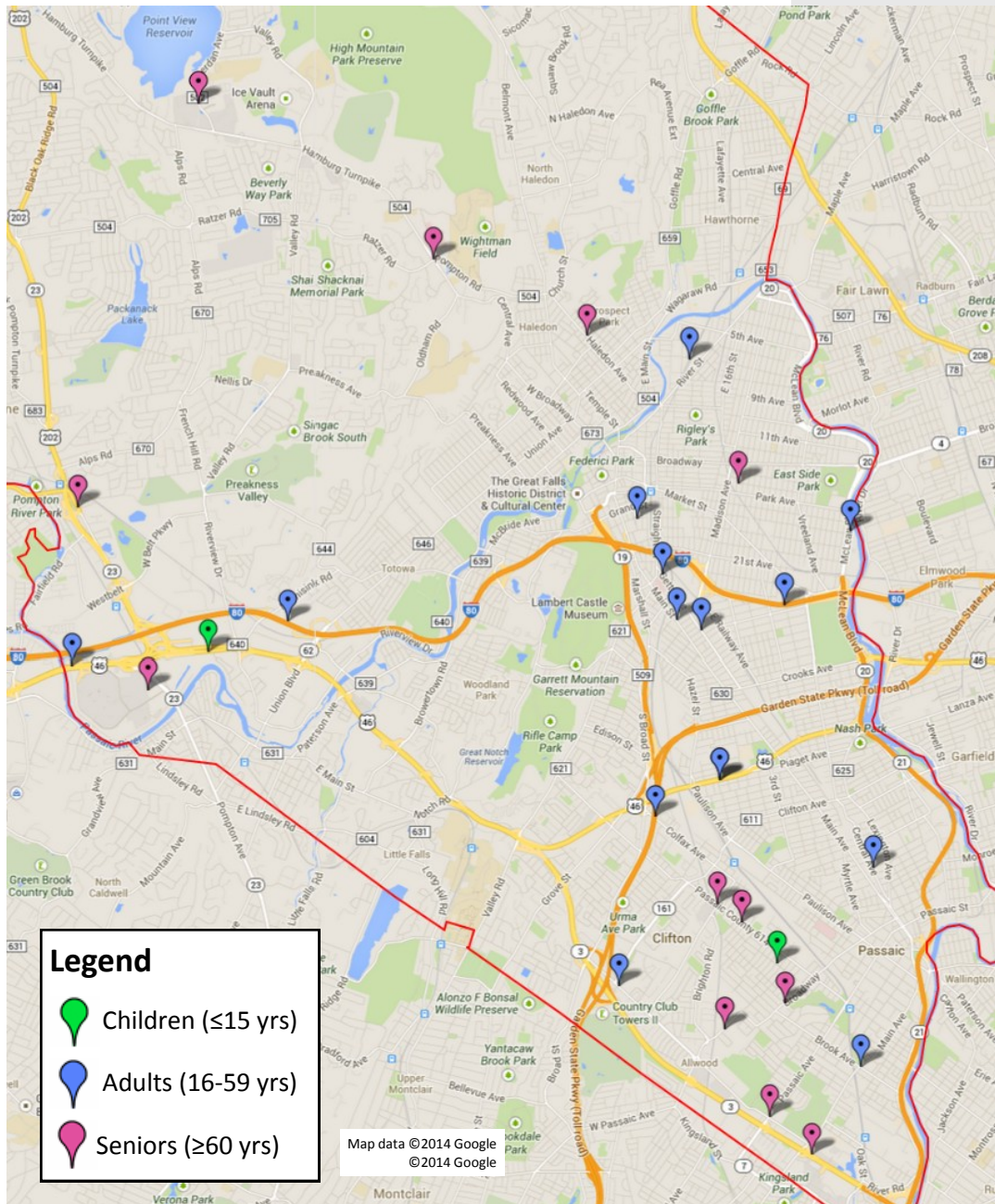
