

THE REGION'S

MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Connecticut

99 pedestrians were killed on Connecticut roads in the three years from 2011 through 2013. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-1 (Boston Post Road) and US-6 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

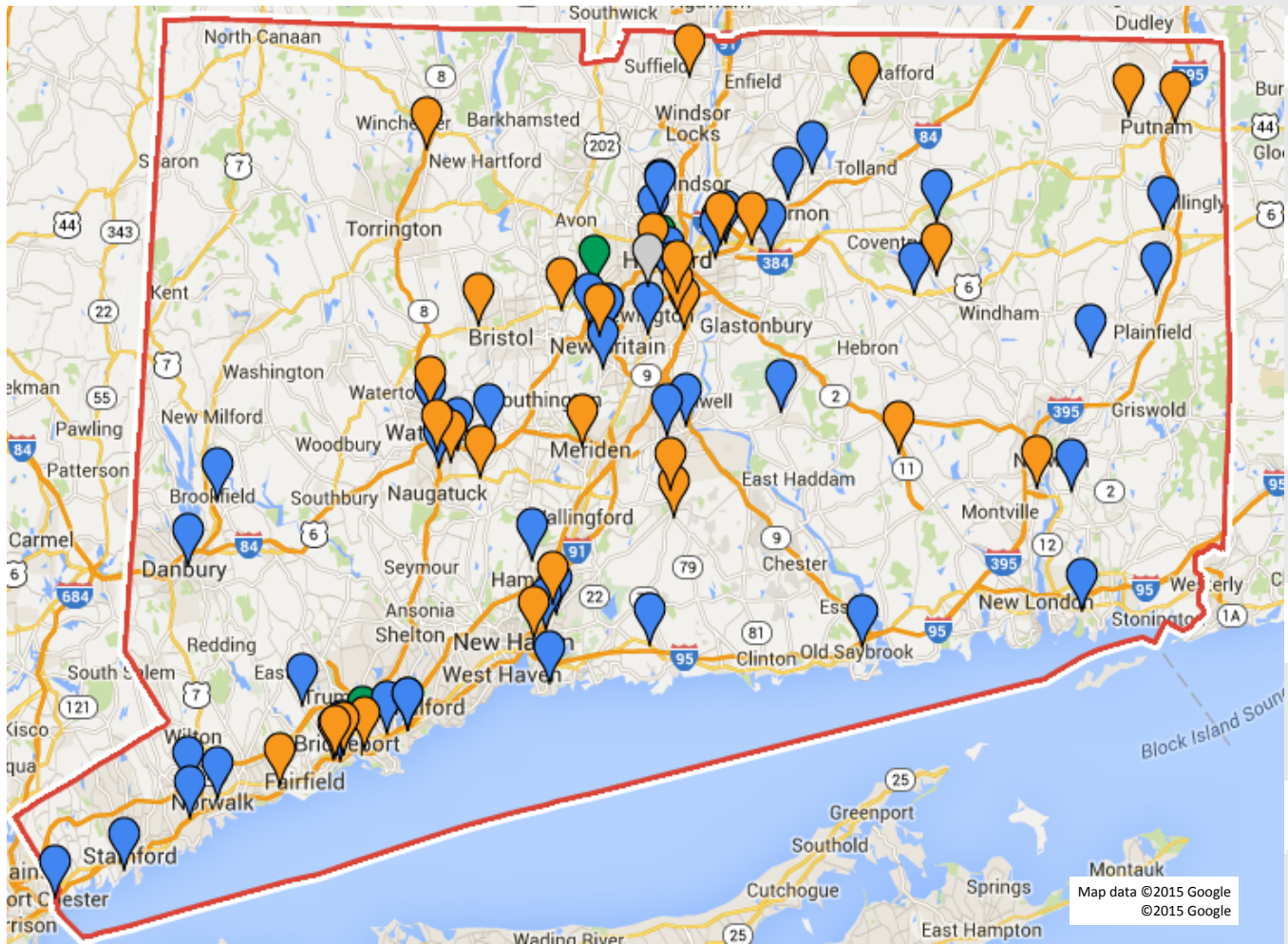
