Manhattan

91 people were killed on Manhattan roads in the three years from 2012 through 2014. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that 3rd Avenue, Broadway, Amsterdam Avenue/10th Avenue, 1st Avenue, and Adam Clayton Powell Jr. Boulevard/7th Avenue had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


