

THE REGION'S

MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Monmouth County

28 people were killed on Monmouth County roads in the three years from 2012 through 2014. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Joline Avenue (SR-36) and SR-35 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

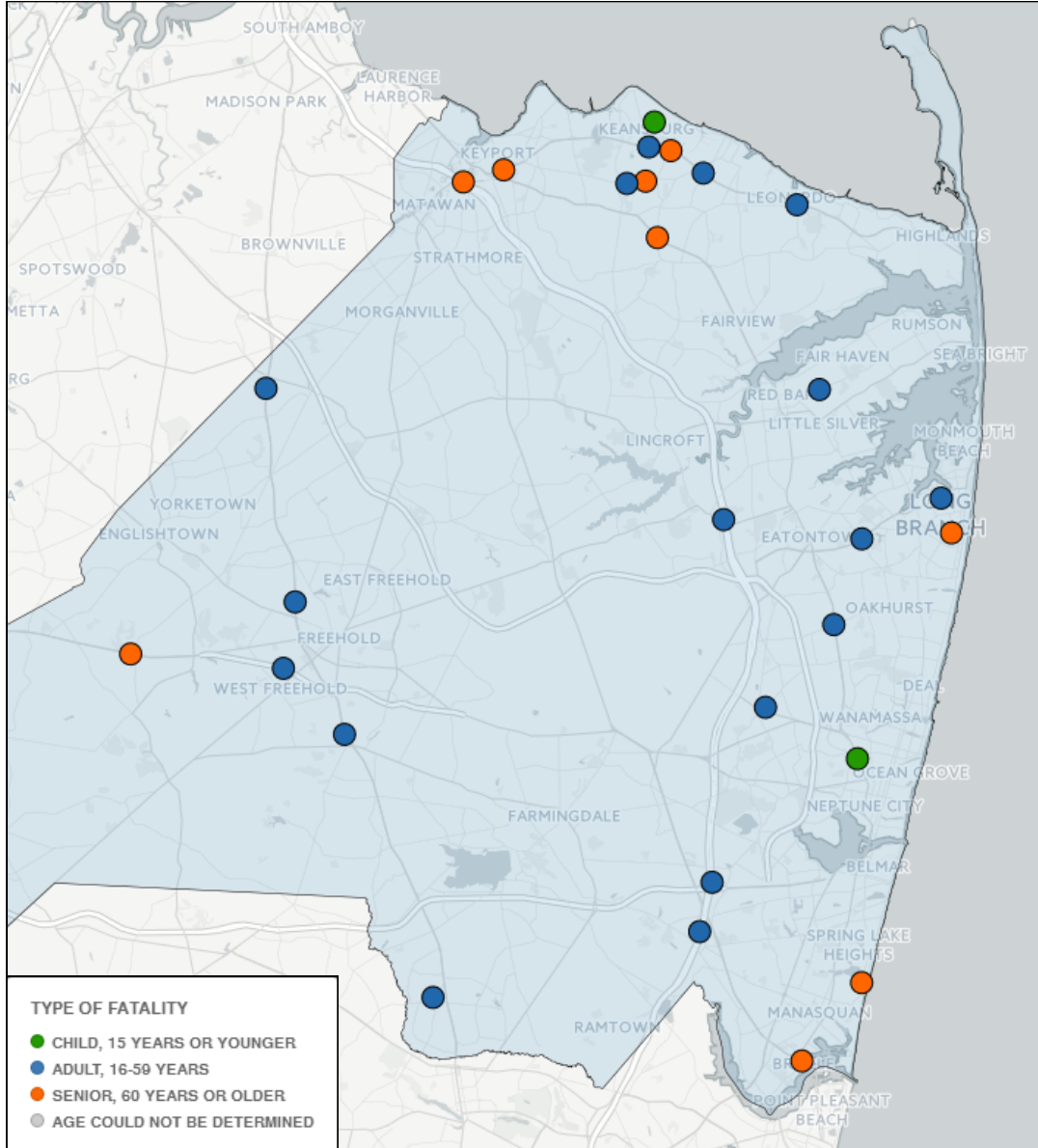
