MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Nassau County

94 people were killed on Nassau County roads in the three years from 2012 through 2014. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Hempstead Turnpike (SR-24), Sunrise Highway (SR-27), Merrick Road, East Park Avenue, and Nassau Road had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


