Staten Island

21 people were killed on Staten Island roads in the three years from 2012 through 2014. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Hylan Boulevard and Victory Boulevard had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


