MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING **Suffolk County**

116 people were killed on Suffolk County roads in the three years from 2012 through 2014. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Middle Country Road (SR-25), Main Street (SR-25A), New York Avenue (SR-110), Sunrise Highway (SR-27), and Montauk Highway (CR-80) had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


