

Impact on District Commuters


- Only 2.2% of district commuters would pay a congestion charge because they drive or take taxis into the central business district (CBD) of Manhattan below 60th Street.
- 13.9% of district commuters take public transit and would benefit from increased funding for transit.
- 12.4% of district workers commute into the CBD and 87.6% do not commute into the CBD.
- The district median income is \$54,009. Workers who drive alone have a lower median income than those who take public transit.
