

#### **Impact on District Commuters**


- Only 4.0% of district commuters would pay a congestion charge because they drive or take taxis into the central business district (CBD) of Manhattan below 60th Street.
- 18.7% of district commuters take public transit and would benefit from increased funding for transit.
- 15.0% of district workers commute into the CBD and 85.0% do not commute into the CBD.
- The district median income is \$43,714. Workers who drive alone have a lower median income than those who take public transit.

### Median Income of Workers 16 Years and Older by Mode




