

Impact on District Commuters


- **Only 2.1% of district commuters would** pay a congestion charge because they drive or take taxis into the central business district (CBD) of Manhattan below 60th Street.
- 55.8% of district commuters take public transit and would benefit from increased funding
- 39.3% of district workers commute into the CBD and 60.7% do not commute into the CBD.
- The district median income is \$44.953. Workers who drive alone have a lower median income than those who take public transit.


