

Impact on District Commuters


- Only 2.3% of district commuters would pay a congestion charge because they drive or take taxis into the central business district (CBD) of Manhattan below 60th Street.
- 65.7% of district commuters take public transit and would benefit from increased funding for transit.
- 39.6% of district workers commute into the CBD and 60.4% do not commute into the CBD.
- The district median income is \$25,486. Workers
 who drive alone have a higher median income than
 those who take public transit.


