
Congestion Pricing District-Level Analysis

Impact on District Commuters

- Only 3.1% of district commuters would pay a congestion charge because they drive or take taxis into the central business district (CBD) of Manhattan below 60th Street.
- 69.3% of district commuters take public transit and would benefit from increased funding for transit.
- 48.7% of district workers commute into the CBD and 51.3% do not commute into the CBD.
- The district median income is \$37,010. Workers who drive alone have a higher median income than those who take public transit.


Median Income of Workers 16 Years and Older by Mode










How Do Commuters Get into the CBD?
