

Impact on District Commuters


- Only 2.4% of district commuters would pay a congestion charge because they drive or take taxis into the central business district (CBD) of Manhattan below 60th Street.
- 11.8% of district commuters take public transit and would benefit from increased funding for transit.
- 11.3% of district workers commute into the CBD and 88.7% do not commute into the CBD.
- The district median income is \$51.749. Workers who drive alone have a lower median income than those who take public transit.






Travel to Work Analysis for District Commuters
