MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING The Bronx

72 pedestrians were killed on Bronx roads in the three years from 2010 through 2012. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that East Gun Hill Road, Fordham Road, Grand Concourse and White Plains Road had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


