Tri-State Transportation Campaign Statement on Closing NYC Subway for Overnight Disinfection

Today, Governor Cuomo made the extraordinary move to shut down New York City's subway from 1 a.m. to 5 a.m. every day to disinfect equipment through the duration of the coronavirus pandemic. In response, Tri-State Transportation Campaign released the following statement:

"We applaud Governor Cuomo and the MTA for stepping up their effort in the fight against coronavirus. The coming weeks and months are going to be challenging for everyone to navigate, but this crisis requires our leaders to take difficult but necessary steps to protect riders and transit workers.

"We're glad to see that the MTA has committed to alternate transit options for essential workers while the subways are closed. We call on the MTA to work with the city to expand bus options, including more frequent overnight service and dedicated lanes for buses and emergency vehicles. The MTA should also establish clear sanitation and social distancing guidelines for dollar van services and for-hire vehicles. This will send a message to the riding public that everyone's safety is the top priority."
